Friends, summer is here finally after that long winter with snow and cold. Early spring the weather wasn't great either. It kept swinging back and forth. As always, summer is a season of enjoyable times with families; a season for vacations, and a moment where we resume our favorite hobbies. A season we take on new tasks where we challenge ourselves or travel to new locations.

Personally, I am challenging myself this summer. I have been wanting to have my own vegetable garden since I came to America. I couldn't wait for the day when I'd have a plot of land and could start growing vegetables, and perhaps raise some sheep, goats and chickens—which is totally different level of commitment than what we have in Africa. Therefore, I am taking on my first garden in America. Before I started digging the soil, I had to ask my amazing neighbor about what comes next and what tools to use etc. I had to buy soil and fertilizer, which is a new experience for me. In Gambella, the area I came from, we never used fertilizer or anything else to help enrich the soil because since we live on a riverbank that floods our farms every rainy season, the river brings new soil to the farmland from the high mountains in the east. I was talking to Apay and laughing about my new, yet inspiring experience of America's farming or gardening method. We will see how my garden turns out!

Moreover, my gardening experience—whether in America or back in Gambel-la—whether the soil is enriched by fertilizer or by new soil from the river, brings to mind some spiritual lessons—the need to enrich our faith with the word of God and fellowship with Christian family. "Do your best to improve your faith by adding goodness, understanding, self-control, patience, devotion to God, concern for others, and love." says Peter (2 Peter 1:5-7). Here, scripture encourages us to make every effort to supplement our faith in every season with knowledge and understanding.

This Spring season, our Bible Study group boldly took on the Book of Revelation in an effort to enrich our faith and understanding. This is a book that many of us ignore or find difficult to understand because of all of the allegories and those mystic creatures. Yet, in Revelation we encounter Jesus who is quite different from the Jesus of the gospels and Epistles. The Jesus of Revelations is the conquering Jesus; Jesus that challenges and cautions his church, yet presents rewards to those who are brave enough to rededicate and recommit to His following and fellowship.

Whether to the sleeping church of Sardis, the church that had abandoned its first love for Christ of Ephesus, or the lukewarm faith church of Laodicea or the Pergamum church that needed to repent, etc. the Jesus of revelation, is the Jesus who presents both the law and grace for his church. He encourages Christian followers to "Fight the good fight of the faith" and keep the faith (1 Timothy 6:12). Therefore, I encourage you to challenge yourself with Bible reading, devotions and prayer, as individuals or as a group. I also invite you to come join our Bible study and be part of that challenge.

What's Happening...

The May 8th monthly Session meeting opened with prayer and a reading from Ephesians 4:1. As we are those who are chosen, we are to act in a way that is worthy. The Book of Order training was on the responsibilities of ruling elders. The May agenda and minutes from the April meeting were approved. The treasurer's report was presented and accepted.

Committee Reports included the following:

Budget, Finance, & Stewardship gave a report about gas and electricity usage for the past two years, accounting for the average temperature.

Discipleship - Confirmation for the communicant class will be scheduled soon.

Family Life- The committee reported on plans for the Pentecost service and breakfast.

Mission— A thank you note was received from a \$100 donation that was sent to the St Francis University Physicians' Assistant group for their recent mission trip.

Pastor/Parish/Personnel/Communication/Nomination—The joint Pentecost service was held at Ebensburg on May 28th.

Property Management: We will attempt to determine the condition of all of the window frames to decide if all need to be replaced. If some are in usable condition, we will approach ServPro to see if the contract can be re-negotiated.

Worship: Plans proceed for the worship service at Presbytery meeting.

In New Business, five items were addressed:

- 1. Church Growth.: Several ideas were discussed. A Suggestion box will be placed in the church for submission of ideas.
- 2. Confirmation. Session voted to schedule confirmation for June 4th, and move communion to June 11.
- 3. Session voted to excuse Amy Brulia for a period and continue to keep her engaged.
- 4. A vote approved study leave for Pastor Owar for July 16-21, and to grant him a four-week vacation beginning July 23 and continuing for the first three weeks of August. He plans to travel to his birth-place in Ethiopia.
- 5. Kevin McKenrick will be the representative to the next Presbytery Meeting.

In the Moderator's Report, Rev. Owar thanked the elders for service and leadership. One new member, Eric Schell, was added on Easter. Rev. Owar plans to take communion to our housebound members. He reported on visits and member's health issues. Four young people will be confirmed. Rev. Owar continues to chair the Mission Committee for Redstone Presbytery and is part of the Ethiopian Mission Network.
