# The Fellowship

"For he is like a blazing fire refining precious metal, and he can bleach the dirtiest garments! <sup>3</sup> Like a refiner of silver he will sit and closely watch as the dross is burned away." (Malachi 3:2 TLB)

Gambella, is one of the regions with tropical savanna climate in Ethiopia. "The hot season lasts for 2.6 months, from January 27 to April 15, with an average daily high temperature above 97°F. The hottest month of the year in Gambēla is March, with an average high of 100°F and low of 78°F. The cool season lasts for 4.3 months, from May 30 to October 6, with an average daily high temperature below 86°F. The coldest month of the year in Gambēla is July, with an average low of 71°F and high of 83°F" (weatherspark.com).

In the months of May through August, Gambella receives an annual rainfall of 600mm or 2.66 inches. During this time everything turns green, and an elephant grass would grow more than ten feet after four months of growth. Yet, in late January, Gambella would go through a rough and rigorous process and things start to change again. With the heat starting to climb, the grass begins to dry, here and there people begin to witness pockets of fire throughout the savanna. People of the area clear the savanna for two reasons: make it accessible for hunting, collect firewood, or/and to *help the savanna regenerate and regrow fresh grass for their livestock*.

It was my first time traveling in the month of January to Gambella in my fifteen years in America. And seeing the burning tall grass of savanna became new to me. Beside seeing my old habit of fishing for redtails during this season, witnessing a burning savanna became fresh to my memory. It was late afternoon, and we were coming back from the village where my dad was buried. Suddenly, I saw dark smoke and birds of prey hovering over, hunting for flying insects on flight from the fire. Oh wow! I was awestruck! These are my childhood experiences, where we would go hunting for small animals. Yet, "my father has been renewed through his death," flashed through my mind. And I was also reminded of Malachi's text as well.

The Bible uses fire as a symbol of purification, renewal, and transformation. The concept of the "refiner's fire" is used to describe the process of spiritual purification that we undergo as believers. God as a refiner, purifies his people through fire, separating them from impurities and refining them like gold and silver. This process comes in different forms, including spiritual tests, challenges, and trials, and reveals our spiritual identity and trust in Christ as we endure, mature in faith, and develop a heart that is eager to serve God. Paul said, "we can rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials, for we know that they help us develop endurance" (Romans 5: 1-5)

# What's Happening...

The Ebensburg Session met on January 8, 2024, with CRE (commissioned ruling elder) Bob Sheehan serving as moderator while Rev. Owar was in Ethiopia. Bob Sheehan filled our pulpit during January and will also fill it in the month of March as Rev. Owar transitions to his new role as full time pastor at Grace Community Presbyterian Church in Lower Burrell, PA. Our church will continue to work with the Presbyterian leadership to explore pastoral options moving forward. Timely exchanges of information between the Session and congregation remains instrumental to a successful outcome.

Prayer, a Bible reading from James 3: 13-18 and approving the agenda were followed by reading about Christ's ministry in the book of order and approving minutes from December Session and Congregation meetings. Then the Treasurer's report was received.

Committee reports included:

Discipleship: A brief discussion about communicants was held.

Family Life: An Ash Wednesday Breakfast and Communion Service is scheduled for February 14<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM. Our sister churches will be invited to attend.
